The film I'm working on now is a documentary on the rich and amazing Sukuma culture:







Despite being the largest ethnic group out of all of Tanzania's 120+ ethnic groups, the Sukuma culture is slowly disappearing due to the confluence of:

- Modernisation,
- Rapid migration of youths from villages to towns and cities, and
- The lack of promotion of the culture.



This documentary will focus on the influential *ngoma* tradition of the Sukuma culture:



- Ngoma carries with it thousands of years of history, culture, knowledge, and creativity.
- *Ngoma* is one of the most important cultural practices that shape the core identity and uniqueness of each ethnic group in Tanzania.
- And the ngoma of the Sukuma people, in particular, encourages cooperation, hard work, and economic growth.





The **Utamaduni Cultural Association** has been playing an important and unexpected role in promoting the Sukuma culture through its annual Utamaduni Cultural Camp.

In addition to documenting the *ngoma* traditions in Sukumaland, the documentary also seeks to highlight the unique cultural exchange and celebration of the Sukuma culture that takes place at the Utamaduni Cultural Camp in Ramten Skov, Denmark every year.

The specific objectives of the documentary are:

- i) To publicize, give exposure to, and generate national and international interest in the Sukuma *ngoma* and culture and to inspire in the Sukuma youth a renewed appreciation of their culture
- ii) To explore and gain insight into the history and development of the Sukuma culture in Denmark
- iii) To document and present the relationship and resonance of the Sukuma culture with Danish culture
- iv) To promote cultural diversity and under-represented forms of expression on the global arts scene.
